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### ❖ **Behavior Programs**

- **Classified Staff Appreciation Week Celebrated at CasPac:** On the week of March 7-11, our classified staff members were honored by the licensed and administrative staff at CasPac. Classified staff received individualized thank you cards from their principals and other licensed staff. A duty free luncheon of pizza was organized by the licensed staff. Special individual/group recognitions were posted throughout the building. There was also daily breakfast and lunch offerings provided to all classified staff during the week for their invaluable efforts in making Cascade and Pacific Academies a successful program to the students we serve.
- **17<sup>th</sup> Annual Pacific Academy Talent Show a Major Success:** Students and staff from Pacific Academy entertained the student body, staff and family members with a variety of art work, a run way fashion show, songs, poetry, skits, musical dance renditions, gymnastics performance, and comedy routines. More than 17 different acts were performed by the students, and they were in charge of all aspects of the production, including two students who acted as co-hosts for the program. A high degree of student involvement, enthusiasm and creativity was evident and reflected by the many students who participated in this annual event.
- **Spirit Week held CasPac Students and Staff to Usher in Spring:** A variety of activities were held during the week of March 14-18 to foster school spirit and the overall morale of students and staff. The daily themes included: favorite sport team day, costume day; favorite band/group day; green day (honoring St. Patrick's Day); and wild dress day.
- **CasPac Student Councils Provide Student a Voice:** Cascade and Pacific Academies have had active student councils operating this year. Both groups have represented their student bodies and have provided a voice to the students in both of the schools. These groups have taken leadership roles in developing a variety of activities including community service (area clean ups), fund raising for student scholarship in support of school wide field trips, food services support, event support including the organization and decoration of the activity room, and input regarding school wide policies and protocols such as dress code and breakfast/lunch menu items.

### ▪ **Day Treatment Program**

- ❖ The secondary students in the Day Treatment Program participated in a presentation in March from the Oregon Humane Society Technical Animal Rescue team. OHSTAR members with animal first-aid and rescue training are available to respond to animal rescue situations that require technical skills in the Portland metropolitan area and adjoining counties. For animal emergencies needing cliff rescue, water rescue, and other urgent situations, OHSTAR responds directly to the incident site. OHSTAR members also assist law enforcement agencies with the safe capture, containment, and transport of distressed animals found in hazardous conditions, including hoarding situations. OHSTAR volunteers are trained to assist during natural and man-made disasters, and have been called upon to assist in large-scale national emergency operations such as Hurricane Katrina and the tornado tragedy in Joplin, Mo.

### ❖ **Facilities**

- We have replaced tiles in the Washington Service Center after the long, wet winter. Hopefully the patches hold before the new roof is installed. We have combined a service agreement with our HVAC company to include Columbia County. They have many service needs.

### ❖ **Safety**

- Regional Safety Meeting – Louisa Partain will be presenting at our next Regional Safety Meeting on April 20 on EMS services/education. GED Testing Activity:

- 1) Mobile Testing Application was approved. Waiting now for Levi Anderson to get their technology piece in place.
- 2) Testing scores were adjusted on March 1, 2016. Numbers are reflected in report of how many students testing with us received their credential. A real positive step for GED.
- 3) GED Testing also adjusted the Social Studies exam. They removed the extended response and lower the time from 95 minutes to 70 minutes.
- 4) Our test center has seen an increase in the number of students/professionals that are not United States Citizens. They can test with us as long as they have current ID. Some professional exams require 2 forms of ID.
- 5) Pearson VUE sent me notification of 15 new tests/certifications that are now available. They continue to add new tests every week.

**District Partnerships**

- Fire Science is going very well for both Hillsboro and Banks School Districts. Currently we have for this school year a total of 78 students participating in the fire science programs. (52 FS I & 26 FS II). Each year we are seeing about a 6-9% increase in students, we are expecting a larger increase in Banks this coming year. Currently, we are the only High School Fire Science program in the area which is a dual credit program with PCC.
